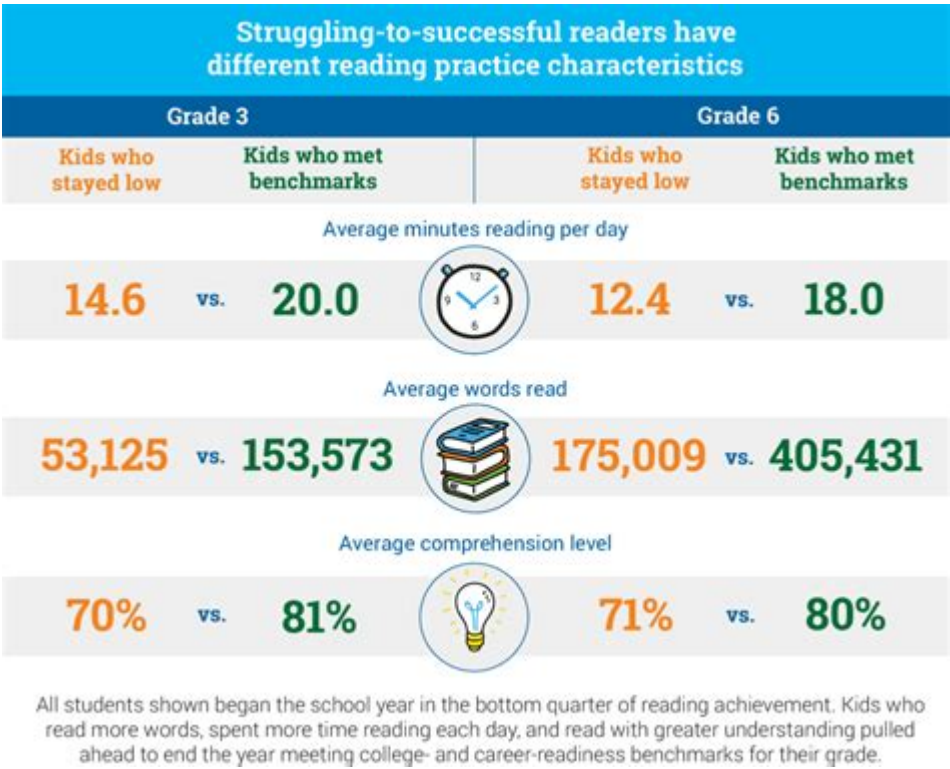
The Enduring Charm of Public Libraries
