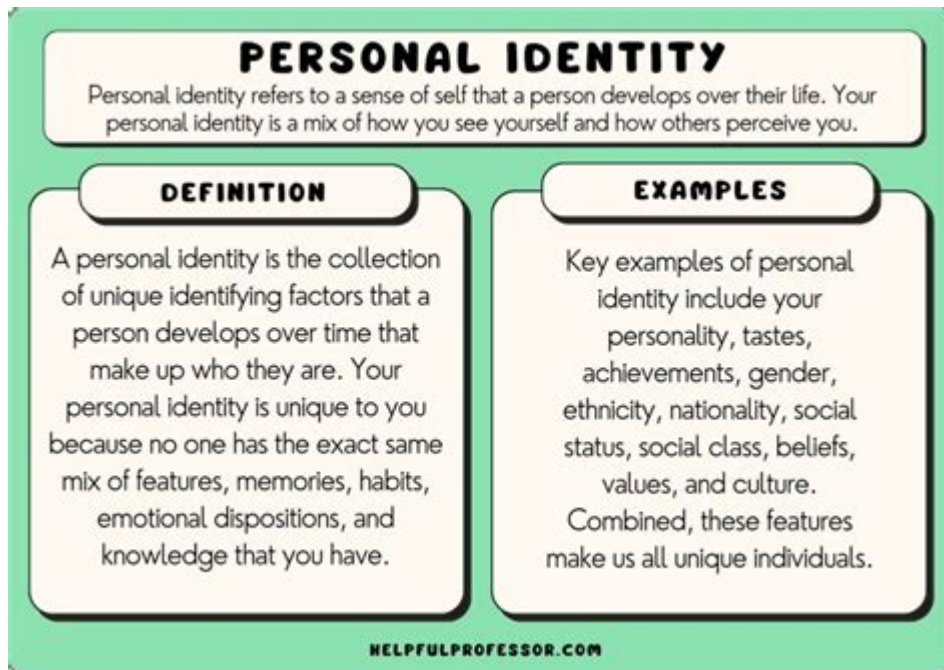


## The Art of Vetting: Separating Diamonds from Dust
