- “Fantasy with unique magic system”

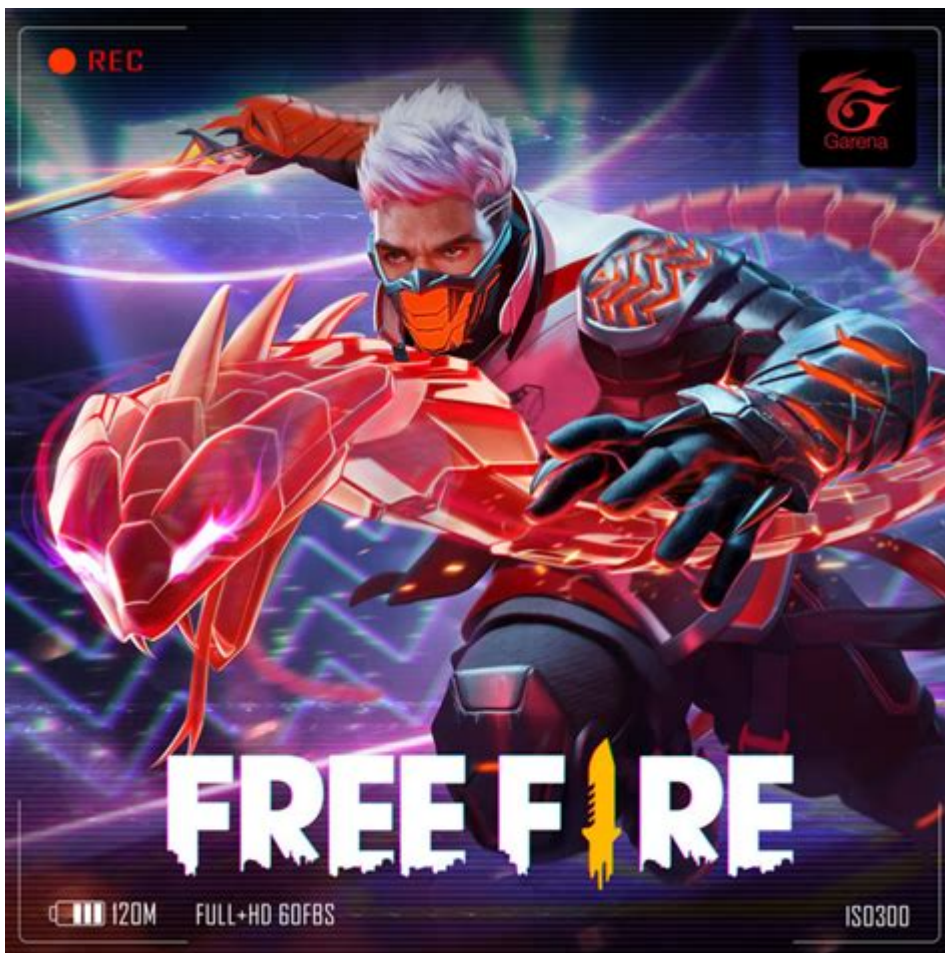
