


- 'historical fiction' in the modern sense, many works of literary fiction are set in specific historical periods and offer profound insights.

- Consistency and Plausibility: Do the characters' actions and reactions align with the known social norms, technologies, and beliefs of the period? Are there anachronisms (e.g., a character using modern slang in 18th-century France)?
- Nuance Over Stereotype: Accurate historical fiction avoids simplistic portrayals of historical figures or groups, instead presenting the complexities and ambiguities of the past.
- Cross-Referencing (if you're keen): For truly immersive readers, a quick search on Wikipedia or a reputable history site about the period or events depicted can reveal major inaccuracies.
- **Reviews:** Often, other readers will comment on a novel's historical accuracy in reviews, giving you a heads-up.
