**Evaluating Online Information**

This framework can be used to evaluate websites, news articles, and other online documents for your research.

Purpose	Creator	Content	Design
<b>What is it?</b> Common forms include web pages, scholarly articles, government publications, news articles, opinions, sales pitches...	<b>Who is the author?</b> Do they have expertise in this area?	Is the information accurate? Is it current?	Does the site look credible?
<b>Who is the intended audience?</b>	<b>Who sponsors the site?</b> <b>Who funds the site?</b> If it is a news site, what journalistic practices do they use? Have the facts been checked?	Does it advertise a product or service?	Is it logically and clearly displayed?

Start with developer reputation. While indie developers can surprise, established studios often bring a certain level of polish. Next, look at player reviews and ratings. A strong positive consensus, especially on platforms with robust review systems, is a good sign. Pay attention to comments regarding gameplay mechanics, story depth, and lack of pay-to-win elements in free-to-play models. Graphics aren't everything, but consistent art style and smooth performance contribute significantly to immersion.

## Community Insights and Expert Curations

Leveraging the collective wisdom of the gaming community is an invaluable strategy for finding hidden treasures. Forums, subreddits, and dedicated gaming communities often highlight excellent free titles that might otherwise go unnoticed.



Websites like [r/FreeGamesOnSteam](#), [r/gamedeals](#), or specific genre-focused communities are excellent places to find recommendations and discussions about free action and adventure titles. Content creators on YouTube and Twitch frequently review and showcase free games, providing visual insights into gameplay before you commit to downloading. Subscribing to gaming newsletters or following reputable gaming news sites can also keep you updated on limited-time free offers and new releases.
