Escalating Stakes with Absurdity

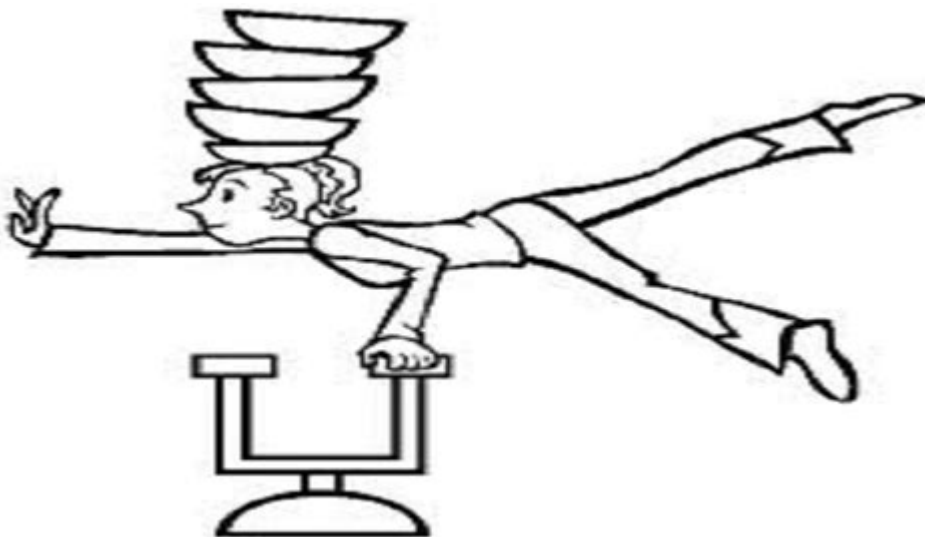
