

- 1. When does the story take place? What is the historical significance of the story?
- 2. Based on your reading, how is life in this period different from life today?
- 3. Who is the main character on this story? How did the historical event or time period affect the character's life?
- 4. What are the conflicts in the story? How are the conflicts resolved?
- 5. Choose a character/person from another time period. How would he/she react to the same conflicts?
- 6. Using examples from your book, explain this statement: "Historical fiction can sometimes give you a better understanding of a time in history than a history book can."
- 7. What is the theme of your book? What "hidden message" is the author trying to send the reader about this historical event or time period?
- 8. Could this story take place during another time or in another place?
- 9. Give a few examples of the different dialects used in the story. How do the dialects affect the story?
- 10. Would you like to trade places with the main character, or would like to have lived during this time period? Why or why not?
