<b>Lesson Procedures:</b> 1. As an intro to the lesson, I will ask them if they know what is setting in a book and what makes a good setting in a book, specifically when visualizing a historical setting. This will later be question 1 on the sheet. 2. To start this lesson, I will read the book <i>When Jessie Came Across the Sea</i> by Amy Hest. This is a historical fiction book that is centered around the area in 1912. I will do this in the seats as they already have flexible seating. That way they are still comfortable but in a good spot to listen. 3. I will then ask some questions regarding the book such as, "How does this book make you feel?" as well as "Can you picture the setting and the feel of the book by the author's words?" 4. When we get to the worksheet, I will read the directions out loud and see if anyone has any questions. This will lead into the worksheet they will fill out individually. During this time, I will be walking around for individual help. 5. Once done, I will ask some to share as well as those who have drawn an illustration picture on the bottom if they want to show it. We will continue to add on each others thoughts until we get a clear representation of the answers. 6. I would like to keep a few of the sheets to take home with me, otherwise students can keep them themselves.
