## Plot Propulsion Through Absurdity

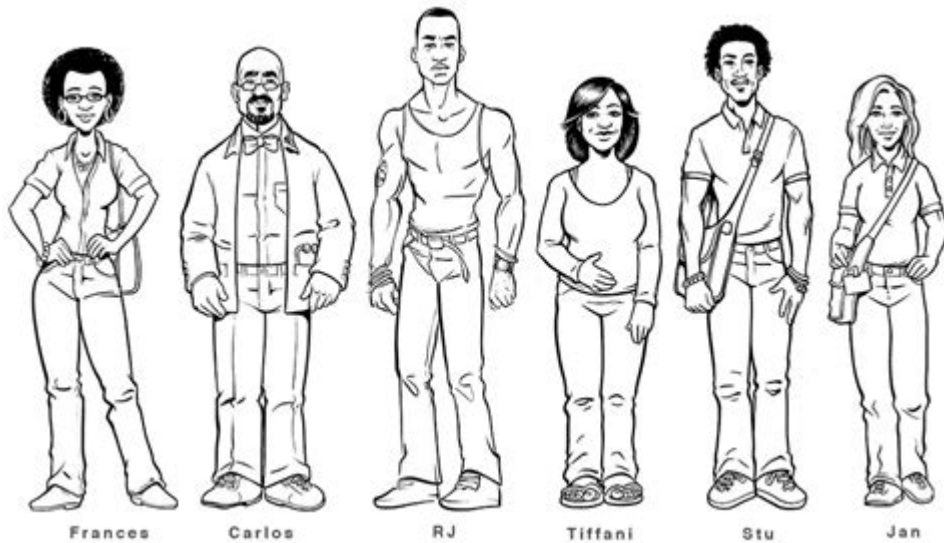
