
### **Libby & OverDrive: Your Digital Public Library**

## **Directly from Authors: Newsletters & Websites**


Many authors leverage freebies as a marketing tool, offering books to build their readership and newsletter subscribers.

## Free Ebook Retailers & Aggregators


Several platforms specialize in aggregating or hosting free ebooks, often with robust search and filtering options.

## Mastering the Art of Filtering for Tropes and Heat Levels


