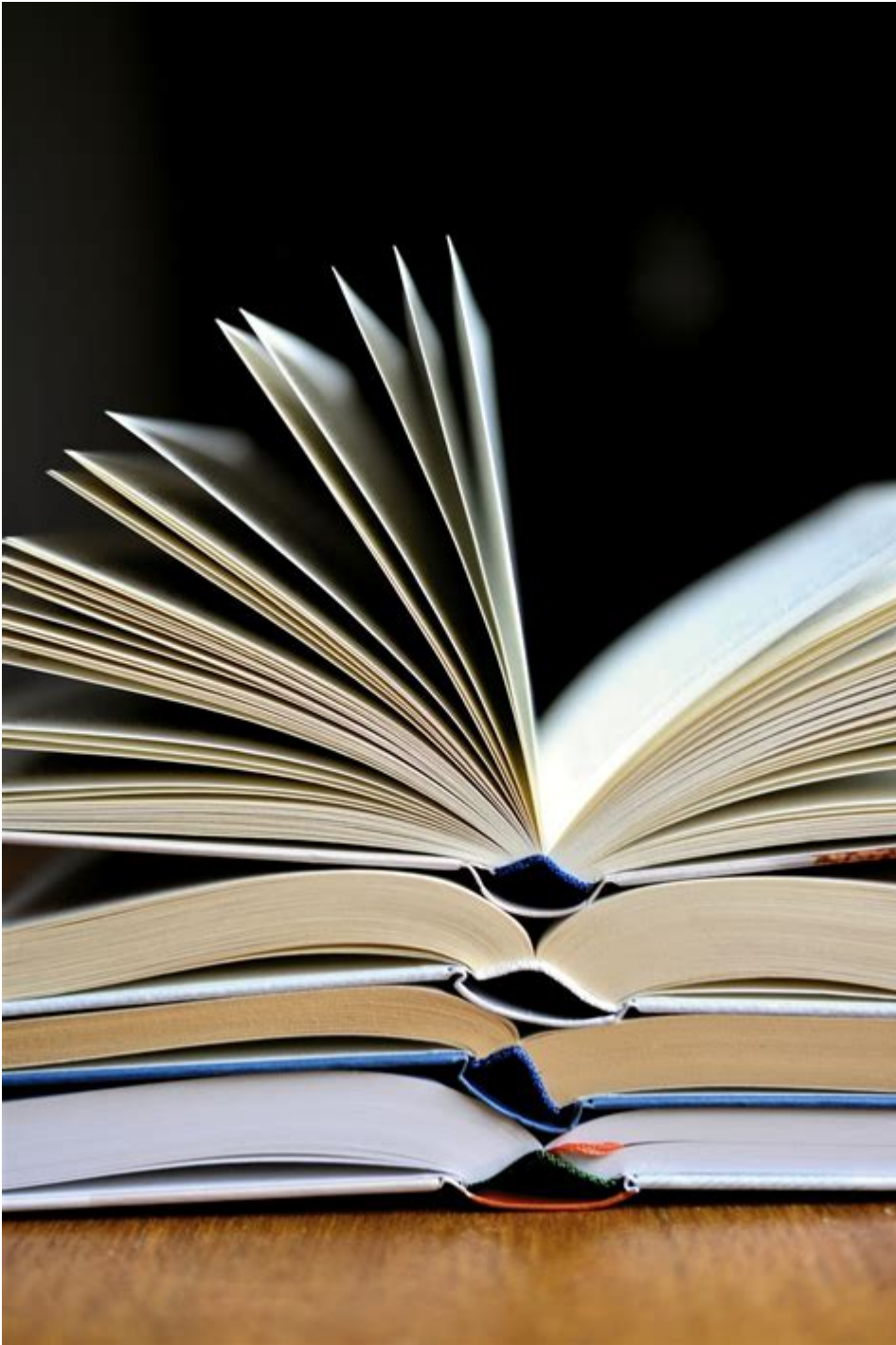
## Engage with Reading Communities and Social Media

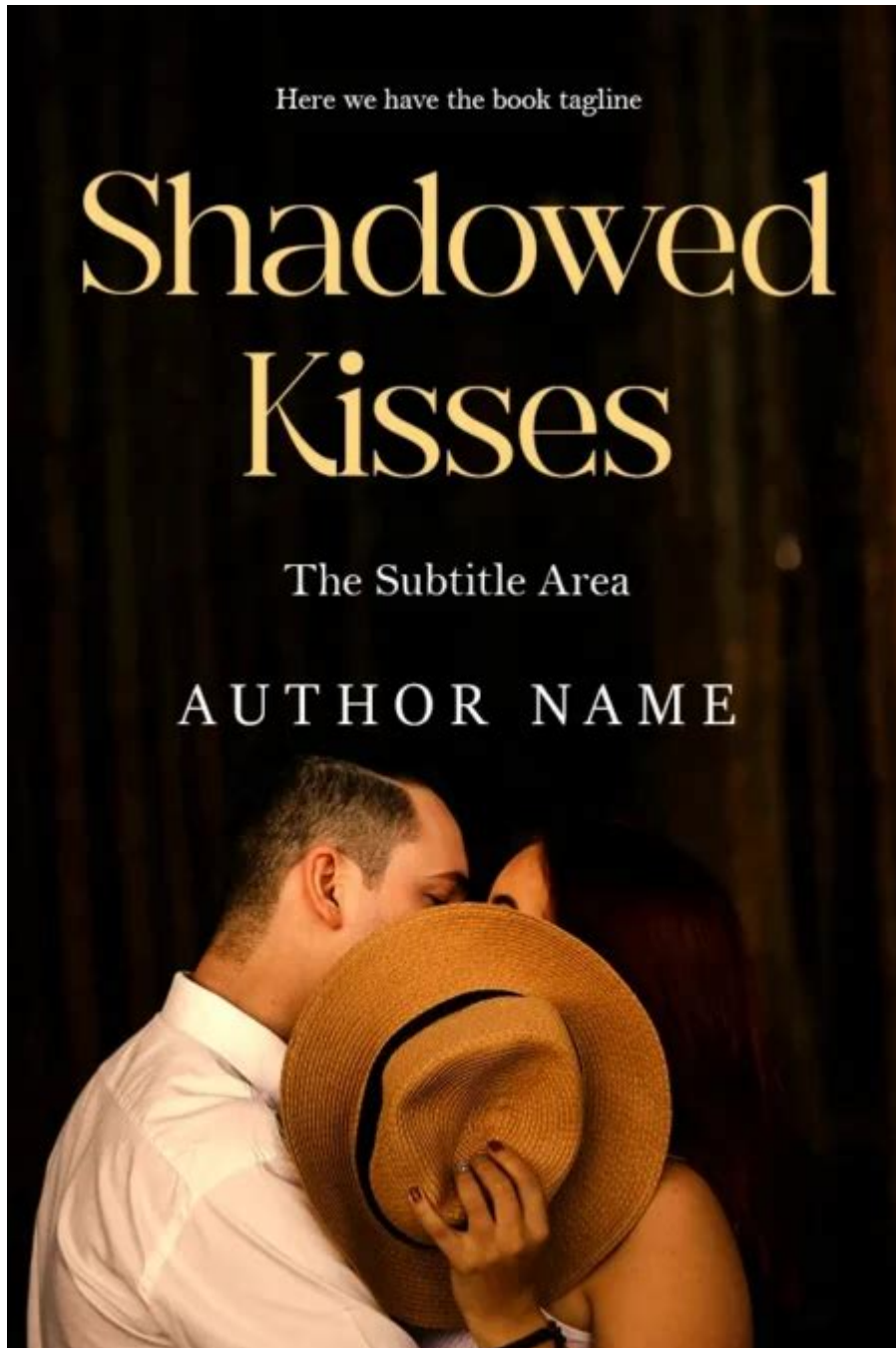
