

- **Mundane SF:** Science fiction set on Earth or within the solar system, strictly adhering to current scientific possibilities without faster-than-light travel or aliens.


Search engines and platform filters allow you to combine ‘free ebook’ with these specific subgenre terms, drastically narrowing down your search to truly unique finds.
