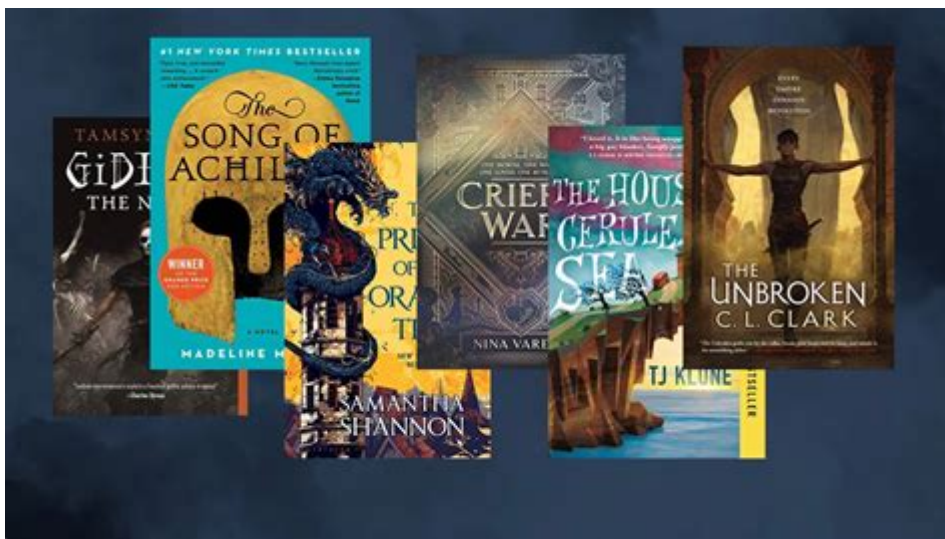
Beyond the Bestsellers: Unconventional Avenues for Adventure
