Subtle jabs, understated sarcasm, or a character's deadpan delivery can often be more potent and organic than overly broad jokes. Remember that physical comedy can also be hinted at or described in dialogue, adding another layer.



Read Aloud and Revise Relentlessly

Dialogue, especially comedic dialogue, is meant to be heard. The ultimate test of its effectiveness is to read it aloud. Does it sound natural? Does the humor land as intended? You might find that a joke that looked great on the page feels forced when spoken. Be ruthless in your revisions. Trim extraneous words, sharpen punchlines, and ensure that every line contributes to either character, plot, or humor. Don't be afraid to cut jokes that don't quite hit the mark; sometimes, less is more when it comes to comedy.
