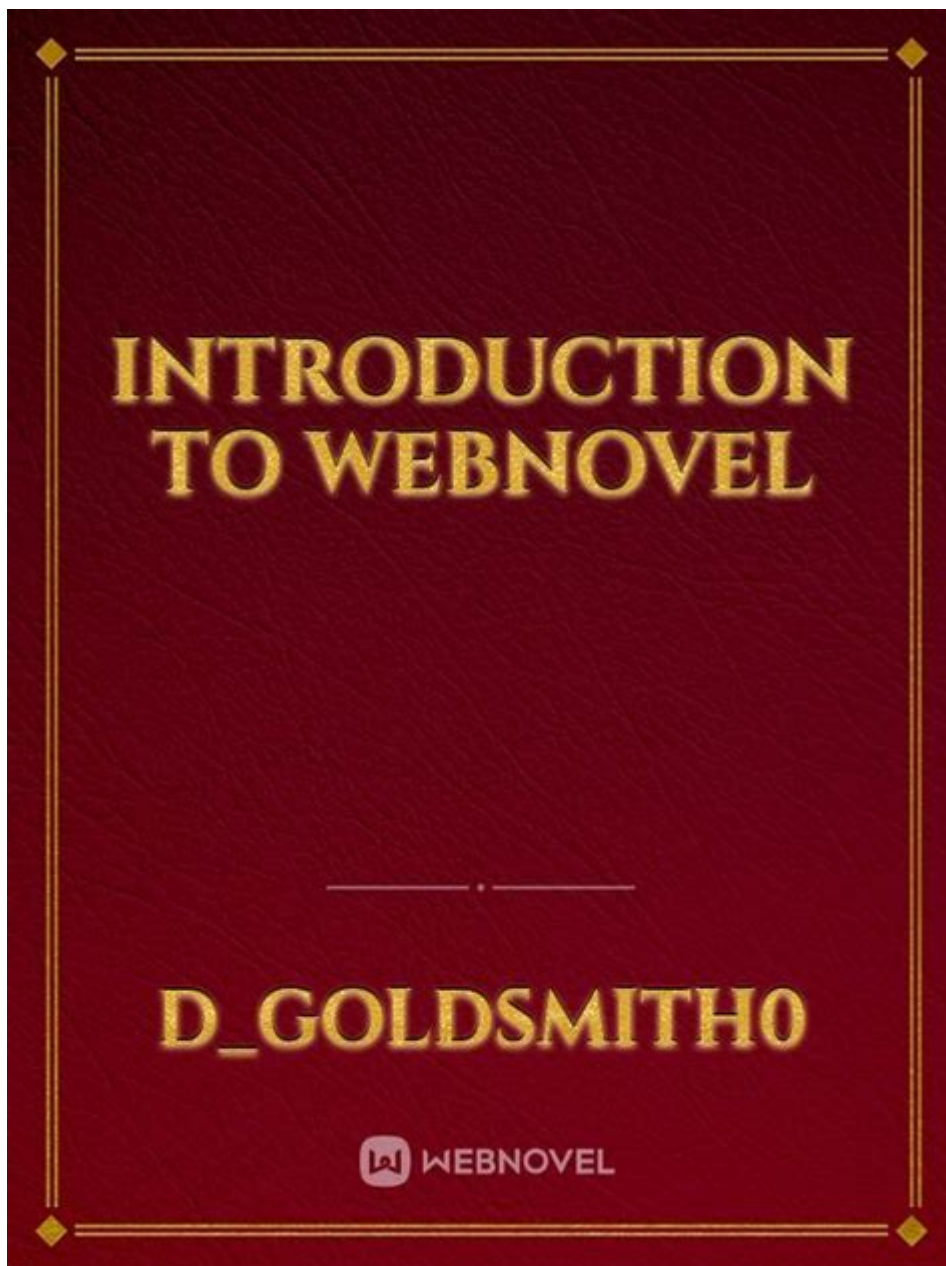
Leveraging Community and Site Resources

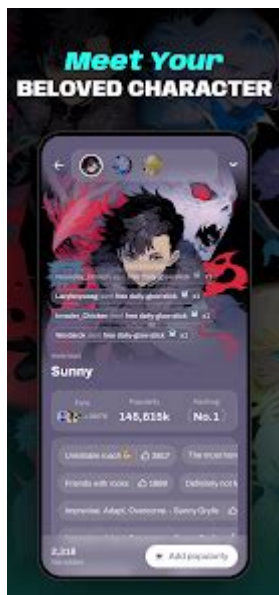


The “First Arc” Test: When to Commit, When to Quit
