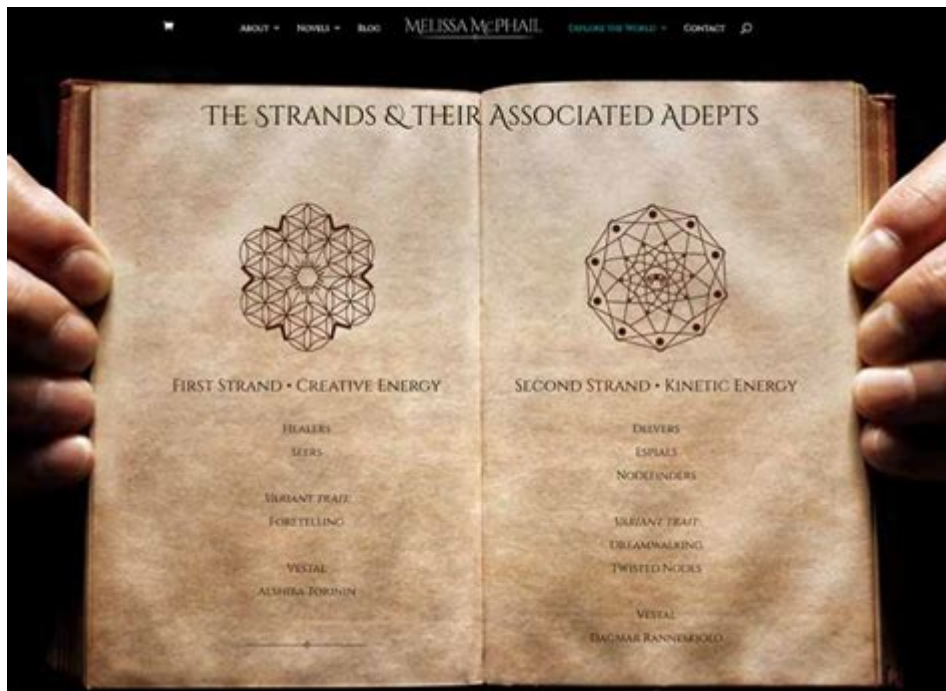


Harness the Wisdom of the Crowd: Community and Curation
