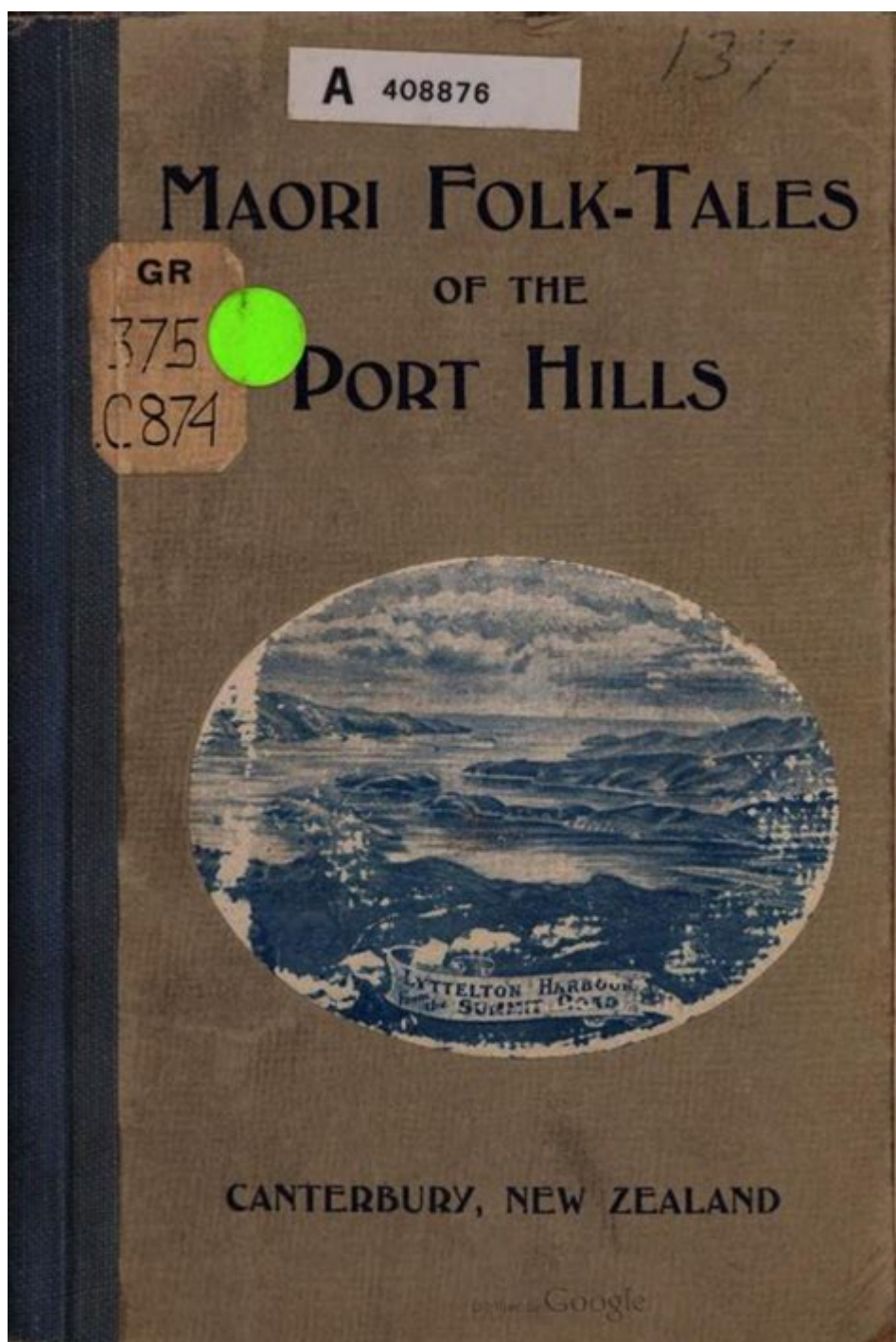

Platforms like Royal Road have “Trending” or “Popular” lists, which are great starting points. Many fantasy communities compile their own “best of free fantasy” lists annually or semi-annually. While popularity doesn't guarantee quality for everyone, it's a good indicator of widespread appeal.
