Mastering the Art of the Search Bar

The search bar is your primary weapon. Don’t just type in ‘romance.’ Be specific!

- **Direct Trope Names:** Always start by typing the exact name of your desired trope, e.g., “enemies to lovers,” “fake dating,” “grumpy sunshine.” Use quotation marks for multi-word phrases to ensure exact matches.
- **Subgenres and Keywords:** Combine tropes with subgenres like “paranormal romance mates” or “historical romance regency forced proximity.”

- **Character Archetypes:** Search for “billionaire romance,” “bad boy romance,” or “nerd heroine.”
- **Boolean Operators (if supported):** Some advanced search engines (like AO3’s) allow “AND,” “OR,” and “NOT.” For instance, “enemies to lovers AND magic NOT vampires” for a specific fantasy romance.



Leveraging Advanced Filters and Tags for Precision

- **Ratings/Content Warnings:** Filter by maturity level or specific content warnings to match your preferences.
