Urban Fantasy (Beyond the Usual)

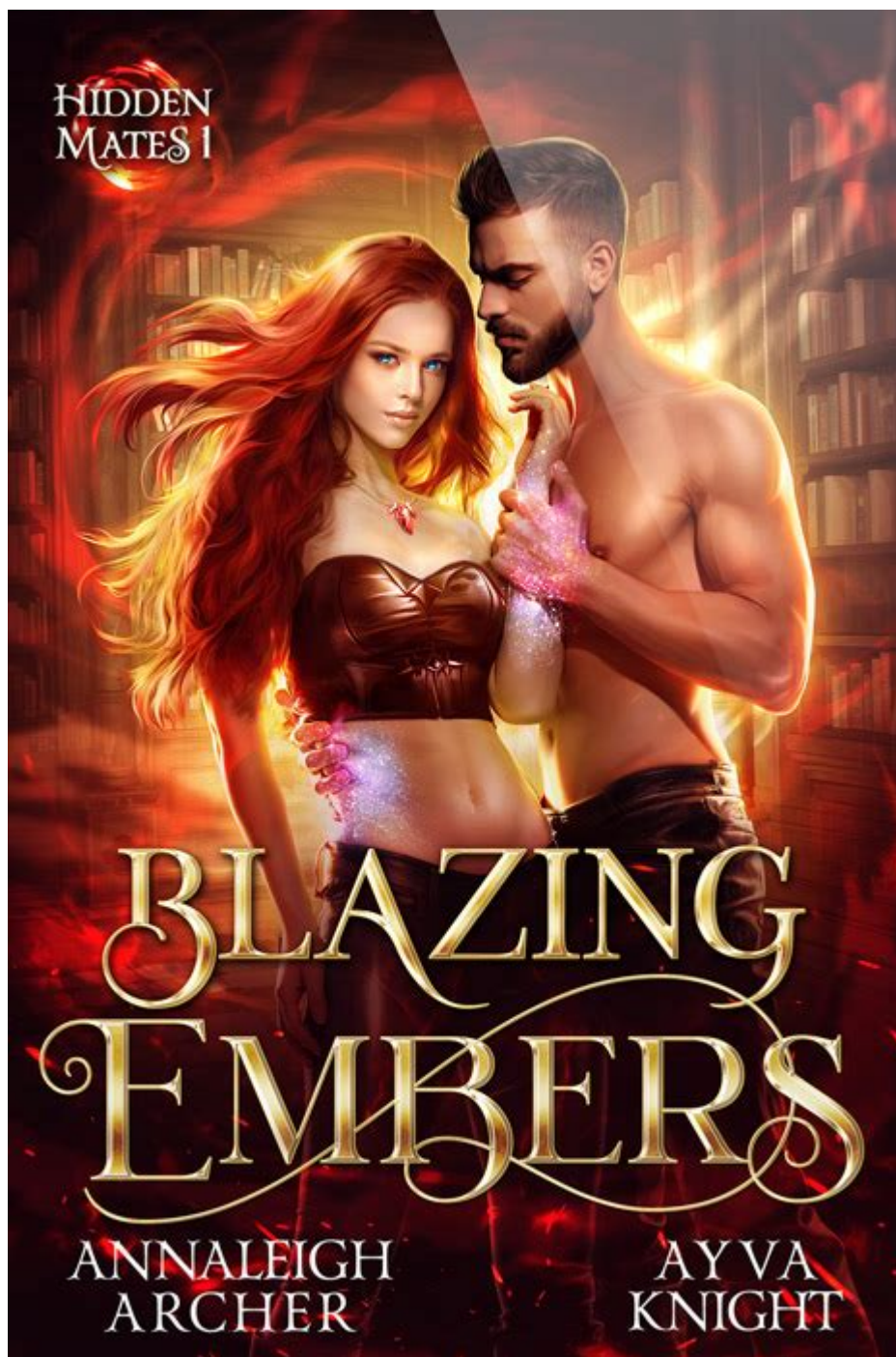
