Put drawbacks on all magical or scientific objects. Let these drawbacks affect your character negatively.



Let the decisions your characters make be the direct cause of conflict, even if they believed their decision would be benificial.



Your characters should be wrong every now and then.



When faced with two choices, both should have positive and negative consequences.
