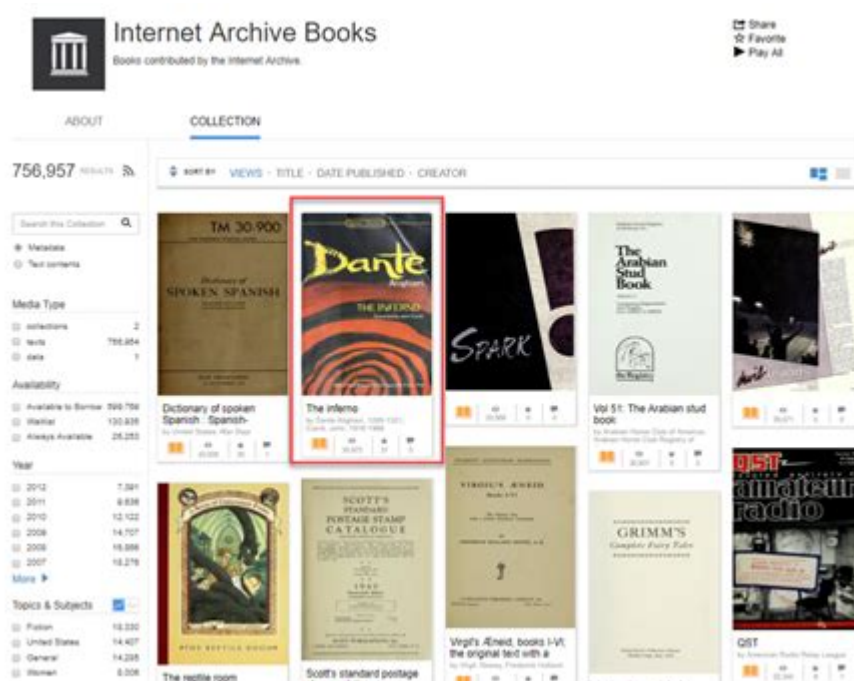
Experiment with different combinations. Google’s advanced search page or similar features on other search engines can also be incredibly useful for filtering results by date, language, and more.

site:	Only shows web site with this address. Site:com site:edu site:k12.va.us
inurl:	The text must appear in the web address Inurl:k12 inurl:advancedplacement
link:	Show other web pages that use this link.
inanchor:	Terms must appear in the anchor text of links to the page

Digital Libraries, Archives, and Open Access Platforms
