

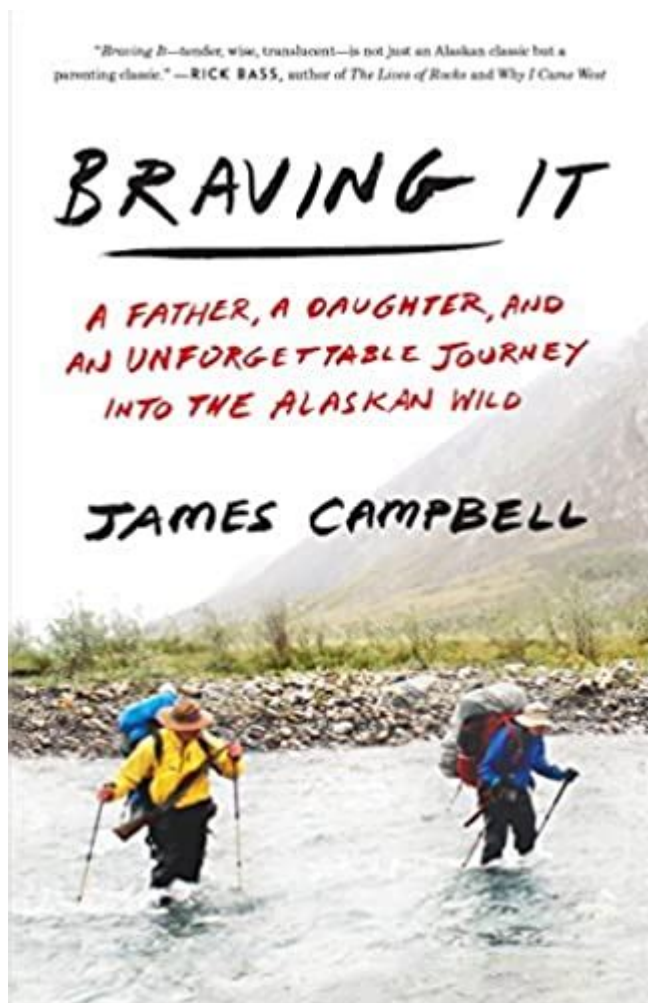

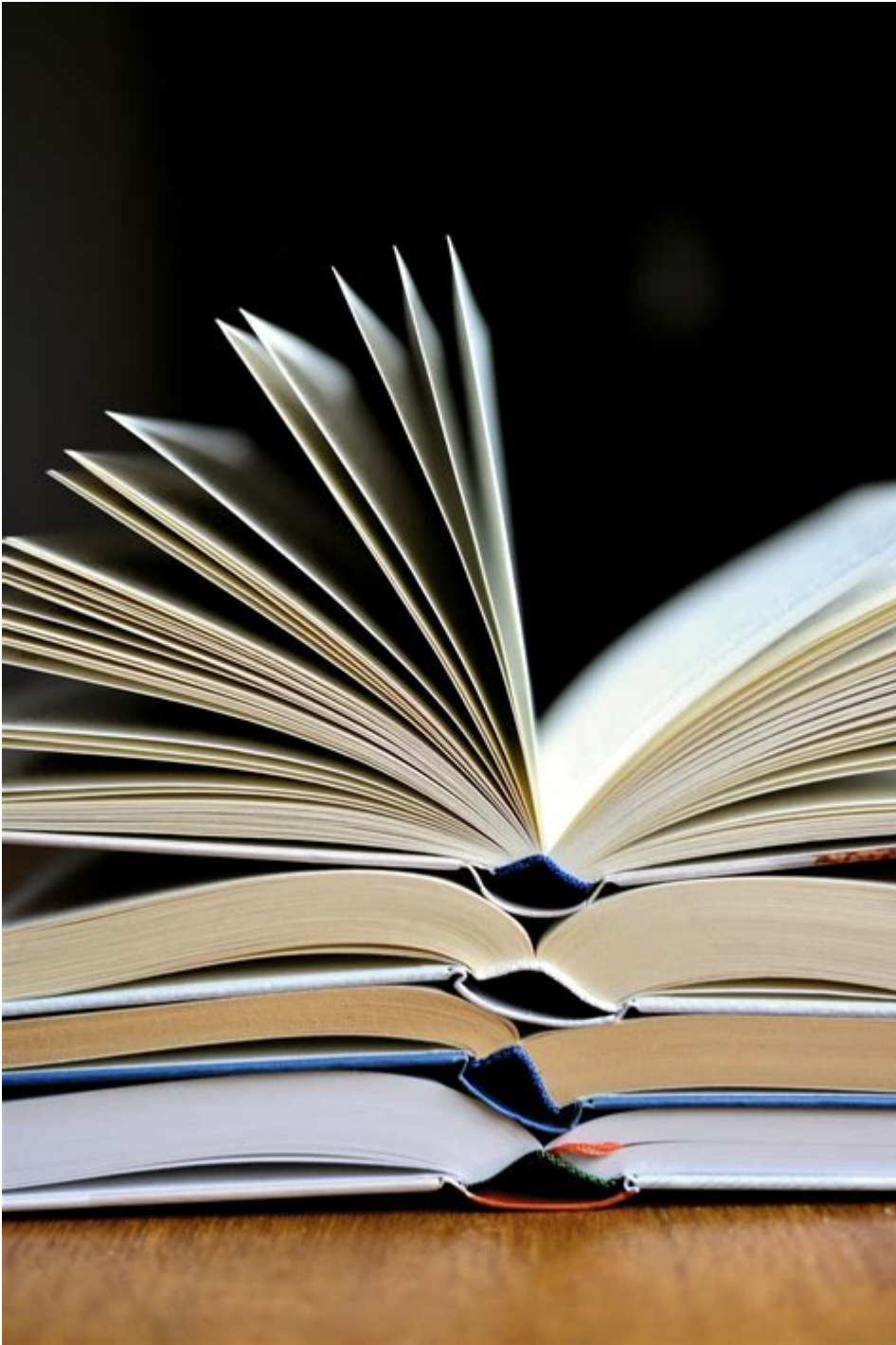

- What role does Catherine play in Melody's physical and emotional progress?
- How do you deal with the frustration of not being able to communicate with someone?
- Do you think it is realistic that nobody called Melody on the morning of the D.C. competition?

Larger theme questions:

- What role does music play in the book?
- How do labels affect the way we look at people?
- How much do we judge people based on their physical appearance?
- What are some ways people can express their individuality when they are physically limited?
- "What your body looks like has nothing to do with how well your brain works!" How do Catherine's words represent a larger theme of the book?
- How do people use others with disabilities as a way to increase their own standing in the world? (ex. The reporter who chose to print the article and put only a photo of Melody on the front cover)
- How much do people's physical appearances represent their identities?
- What are the characteristics of a true friendship?
- How often do people wish they had what others have? How does this affect their daily lives?
