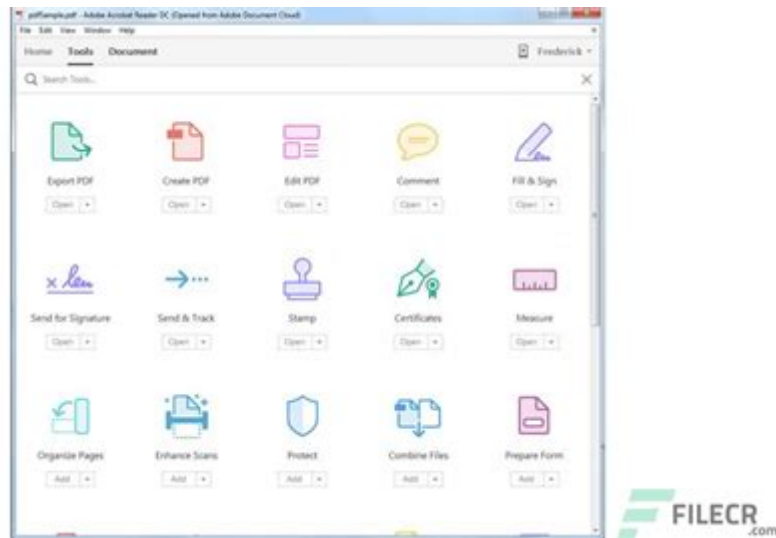

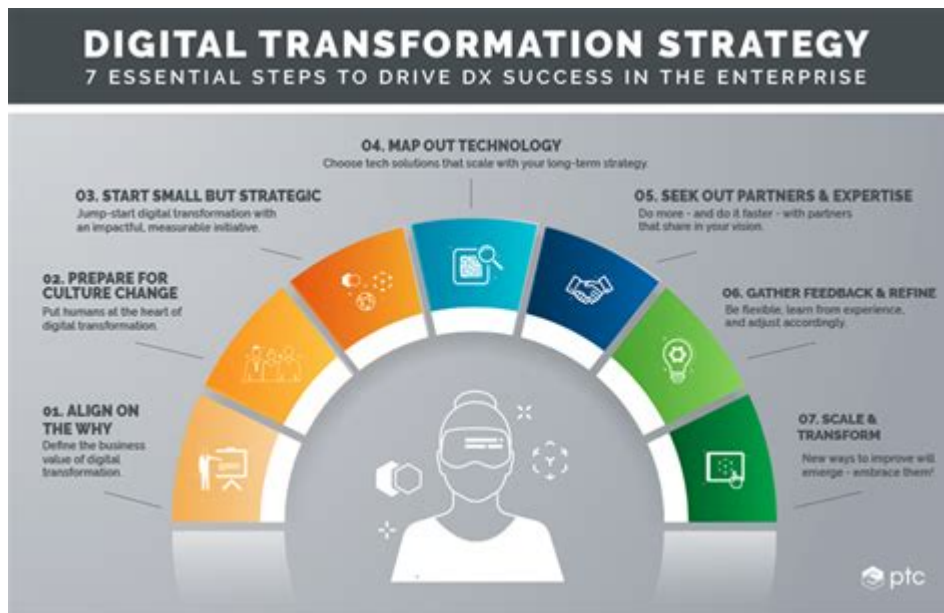


4. Sample and Experiment Liberally
