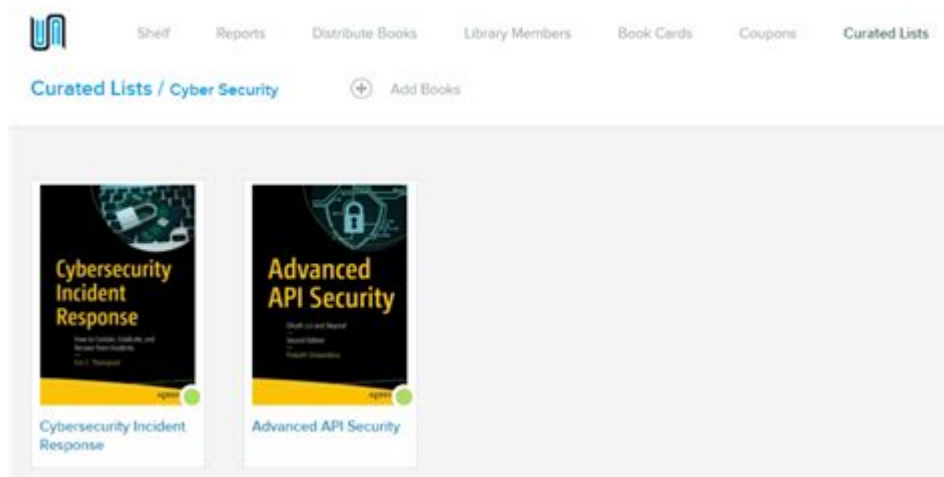
Leverage Reviews and Community Ratings
