i.e., Last In First Out (**LIFO**)

- **Public Libraries (Libby & OverDrive):** Your local library card is a golden ticket to thousands of free ebooks and audiobooks. Many libraries have extensive collections of new and popular mysteries and thrillers available digitally through apps like Libby or OverDrive.
- **Ebook Retailers' Free Sections:** Amazon, Kobo, Google Books, and Apple Books all have dedicated sections for free ebooks. These often include first-in-series books, novellas, or promotional offerings from independent and established authors alike. Keep an eye on daily deals.
- **Author Newsletters & Websites:** Many authors offer a free ebook (often a prequel or the first book in a series) to subscribers of their newsletters. This is an excellent way to discover new voices directly.
- **Project Gutenberg:** While primarily for public domain classics, you can find foundational mysteries from authors like Arthur Conan Doyle or Agatha Christie here.
- **Book Promotion Sites:** Services like BookBub, Freebooksy, and ManyBooks aggregate daily free and discounted ebook deals directly to your inbox, often filtered by genre.
